

Design a Penguin Flag for the Field Station.

Our lonely hut is near the Adelie Penguin breeding colony at Cape Royds, Antarctica. Many distinguished visitors come to see the penguins and learn about Antarctica throughout the season. If your class would like to design and make a penguin flag for us to fly at the hut we will take a picture of it, sign it and return it to your school. Use the following guidelines to help you create your design.

Flags must be postmarked by **Dec 15, 2011**, or they will not reach us in time to be flown.

Size: between 12 x 18 inches and 4 x 3 feet.

Design: Create a picture about penguins or Antarctica. Incorporating your school's logo or name is fine.

Material: Strong fabric, remember the winds in Antarctica are fierce, nylon works best. Please add a sleeve (at least 2.5 inches wide) or grommets so we can attach the flag to our pole. Everything attached must be sewn NOT glued. The winds remove glued items and they pollute our pristine environment.
